Test and Stay program:

Please note- there is no cost to families to participate in this program.

Families who wish to take part in the Test and Stay program (if deemed necessary) must first register their student with the state's testing provider, CIC Health. We encourage all families to register their children as soon as possible. Families should follow these steps:

1. Log on to the CIC Health website.
2. Click on "Consent Now".
3. Select Sturgis Charter Public School as the school district.
4. Select the appropriate campus (East or West).
5. For students under 18, select "Sign Consent for a Minor" and enter the appropriate demographic information.
6. Students 18 and over must select "Consent for Yourself" due to HIPPA regulations. Families are encouraged to provide assistance for these students.

Please note that Sturgis is only participating in the Test and Stay program. We are not participating in Pooled Testing.

- Put away all music, notes, and other inappropriate exam material
- Be spaced appropriately from one another when sitting the test
- Only be allowed out of the room for emergencies
- Only be let out of the room one at a time in the case of such emergencies
- Bring silent work to do if they finish the exam early

9th and 10th grade students will receive their second semester schedules via the Community Portal no later than the week of midterm exams.

Buses for Mid-Terms: Barnstable buses, as well as the Bridge bus, will arrive at 1:00 on Jan. 18,19,20 and at 10:30 on the 21st.

CCRT will not pick up at that time, and students taking CCRT buses that need to walk will need to make other plans.

January 26-28 and January 31 All Sturgis EL (English Learner) students will be taking the ACCESS for ELs language proficiency test on January 26-28 and January 31.
